<i>Heracleum maximum</i>	<input type="checkbox"/>	Cow Parsnip	white; huge lvs and umbels; huge plant
<i>Ligusticum porteri</i>	<input type="checkbox"/>	Porter's Wild Lovage, Osha	white; dissected lvs; tall plant
<i>Oreoxis alpinus</i>	<input type="checkbox"/>	Tundra Alpine-parsley	yllw; lvs appear pinnate w divided leaflets; involucl bracts narrow and entire
<i>Oreoxis bakeri</i>	<input type="checkbox"/>	Baker's Alpine-parsley	yllw; lvs appear pinnate w divided leaflets; involucl bracts wide and tri-parted
<i>Oxypolis fendleri</i>	<input type="checkbox"/>	Fendler's Cowbane	white; once-pinnate leaves; medium height; likes wet areas
<i>Podistera eastwoodiae</i>	<input type="checkbox"/>	Eastwood's Woodroot	yllw; lvs appear pinnate w fan-shaped leaflets; involucl bracts long and tri-parted
<i>Psuedocymopterus montanus</i>	<input type="checkbox"/>	Mountain Parsley	yllw; lvs bipinnate w ultimate divisions narrow; tall in forests but very low on tundra

## ASTERACEAE -- Sunflower Family

<i>Achillea millefolium</i>	<input type="checkbox"/>	Common Yarrow, Milfoil	white; just a few rays & disks per flowerhead; finely dissected lvs; aromatic
<i>Agoseris aurantiaca</i>	<input type="checkbox"/>	Orange False-dandelion	orange; no disk flowers; milky sap; dandelion-like lvs all basal
<i>Agoseris glauca</i>	<input type="checkbox"/>	False-dandelion	yellow; no disk flowers; milky sap; dandelion-like lvs all basal
<i>Antennaria corymbosa</i>	<input type="checkbox"/>	Flat-top Pussytoes	white; rayless; very low mat; fuzzy white leaves; dark spot in center of phyllaries
<i>Arnica cordifolia</i>	<input type="checkbox"/>	Heart-leaf Arnica	yellow; ray flowers present; heart-shaped leaves
<i>Arnica mollis</i>	<input type="checkbox"/>	Cordilleran Leopardbane	yellow; ray flowers present; brown pappus; tall plant
<i>Arnica rydbergii</i>	<input type="checkbox"/>	Subalpine Leopardbane	yellow; ray flowers present; acuminate leaves
<i>Artemisia scopulorum</i>	<input type="checkbox"/>	Alpine Sagebrush	yellowish w black on phyllaries; inconspicuous flower heads; rayless; common
<i>Artemisia campestris</i>	<input type="checkbox"/>	Pacific Wormwood	larger plant than above
<i>Chaenactis douglasii var alpina</i>	<input type="checkbox"/>	Pincushion; dusty maiden	white; rayless; grayish hairy lvs largest near base
<i>Cirsium eatonii var hesperium</i>	<input type="checkbox"/>	Eaton's Thistle	purplish; rayless; bristly; flower heads sessile on elongate stalk
<i>Erigeron compositus</i>	<input type="checkbox"/>	Cut-leaf Fleabane	white; sometimes w yllw disks only; leaves repeatedly ternately divided
<i>Erigeron coulteri</i>	<input type="checkbox"/>	Large Mountain Fleabane	white; large wide rays; tall plant
<i>Erigeron elatior</i>	<input type="checkbox"/>	Tall Fleabane	Lavender; long-hairy, reflexed phyllaries; tall plant
<i>Erigeron grandiflorus</i>	<input type="checkbox"/>	Large-flower Fleabane	purplish; white hair on phyllaries; small plant
<i>Erigeron leiomerus</i>	<input type="checkbox"/>	Rockslide Fleabane	lavender; spatulate-oblongeolot leaves; grows on rocky sites; low plant
<i>Erigeron melanocephalus</i>	<input type="checkbox"/>	Black-head Fleabane	whitish; long purple hairs on phyllaries; small plant
<i>Erigeron peregrinus var peregrinus</i>	<input type="checkbox"/>	Subalpine Fleabane	lavendar; glandular hairy phyllaries; relatively wide rays; large plant
<i>Erigeron pinnatisectus</i>	<input type="checkbox"/>	Feather-leaf Fleabane	purplish; pinnatifid leaves; low plant
<i>Erigeron vagus</i>	<input type="checkbox"/>	Rambling Fleabane	white; leaves fan-shaped w/ 3 broad, round lobes; low plant
<i>Helianthella quinquenervis</i>	<input type="checkbox"/>	Nodding Dwarf Sunflower	yellow; rays & disks; tall sunflower-like plant; mostly subalpine

<i>Heterotheca pumila</i>		Alpine False Golden-aster	yellow; rays & disks; forms mounds; pleasant aromatic foliage
<i>Hymenoxys hoopesii</i>		Orange Sneezeweed	yellow; disks & long, skinny rays; almost succulent, glabrous lvs; tall plant
<i>Machaeranthera coloradoensis</i>		Colorado Tansy-aster	bright purple rays; coarsely toothed leaves; low plant; very showy; rare
<i>Oreochrysum parryi</i>		Parry's-goldenweed	yellow; disks & short rays; lvs entire; upper lvs crowded below head & phyllary-like
<i>Packera dimorphophylla</i>		Two-leaf Groundsel	yellow; disk & rays; stem lvs much more toothed than basal lvs; short plant
<i>Packera werniiifolia</i>		Alpine Groundsel	yellow; disks & rays; round-spatulate lvs; low, mat-like mounds
<i>Senecio amplexens var amplexens</i>		Daffodil Senecio	yellow; disks & long rays; nodding flower heads; tall plant
<i>Senecio amplexens var holmii</i>			like above, but shorter plant; more rounded & succulent leaves
<i>Senecio atratus</i>		Black-tip Ragwort	yellow; disks & rays; large plant; likes disturbed ground
<i>Senecio bigelovii</i>		Strap Flower, Nodding Ragwort	yellow; disks only; nodding flower head; tall plant
<i>Senecio crassulus</i>		Thick-leaf Ragwort	yellow; disks & rays; tall plant
<i>Senecio fremontii</i>		Dwarf Mountain Ragwort	yellow; disks & rays; thick, succulent, toothed leaves; low mounded plants
<i>Senecio serra</i>			yellow; disks & rays; finely serrate narrow leaves; tall plant
<i>Senecio soldanella</i>		Colorado Ragwort	yellow; disks & rays; purple foliage; low plant; alpine scree & bare dirt
<i>Senecio triangularis</i>		Arrow-leaf Ragwort	yellow; disks & rays; narrow triangle-shaped toothed leaves; tall plant
<i>Solidago multiradiata</i>		Rocky Mountain Goldenrod	yellow; rays & disks; relatively few rays (+/- 13) are short
<i>Taraxacum ceratophorum</i>		Horned Dandelion	yellow; a miniature dandelion
<i>Taraxacum officinale</i>		Common Dandelion	yellow; rays only; milky sap; low plant
<i>Tetraneuris grandiflora</i>		Old-man-in-the-mountain	yllw rays & disks; huge flwr heads face horizontal; dissected hairy lvs; medium plant
<i>Tonestus pygmaeus</i>		Serpentweed	yellow; rays & disks; broad leaf-like phyllaries; low plants
<i>Townsendia rothrockii</i>		Rothrock's Townsend Daisy	whitish; rays & disks; caespitose clump; entire, somewhat fleshy leaves

<i>Eritrichium nanum var elongatum</i>		Arctic Alpine-forget-me-not	blue; low mat plant
<i>Mertensia ciliata</i>		Tall Finge Bluebells	blue to purple; glabrous bluish-green leaves; tall plant
<i>Mertensia franciscana</i>		Franciscan Bluebells	blue to purple; pustulant hairs on upper leaf surface; leaves dark green; tall plant
<i>Mertensia lanceolata</i>		Prairie Bluebells	blue to purple; pubescent leaves; short plant

## BRASSICACEAE -- Mustard Family

<i>Boechea lemmonii</i>		Soldier Rockcross	purple; sprawling flowering stems; low plant
<i>Boechea stricta</i>		Canadian Rockcross	whitish; erect & appressed siliques & pedicels, medium plant
<i>Cardamine cordifolia</i>		Large Mountain Bittercress	white; thick stands along streams; tall plant
<i>Descurania incana</i>		Mountain Tansy-mustard	yellow; flowers inconspicuous; pedicels appressed against the rachis
<i>Draba aurea</i>		Golden Whitlow-grass	yellow; entire cauline lvs; low plant
<i>Draba breweri var cana</i>		Cushion Whitlow-grass	creamy white; low plant
<i>Draba crassa</i>		Thick-leaf Whitlow-grass	yellow; large entire, succulent, ciliate lvs; low plant
<i>Draba crassifolia</i>		Snowbed Whitlow-grass	yellow; tiny basal rosette & scape; tiny plant
